

PLANNING:

What do I need to do?

B1 Develop a proposal for a product/outcome to serve the identified need

B2 plan and record the development process of the project

B3 demonstrate self-management skills.

How?

1. **Develop a proposal** for a product/outcome
2. **Continue doing research and finalise your research paper**– select, evaluate and acknowledge information
3. Work on the **preparation (action plan)** for the service as action product/outcome

Reflect: record information and development.

You need to submit your completed investigation by 17th January.

It needs to include:

- **Research/guiding question,**
- **Global Context and its exploration,**
- **4 learning outcomes,**
- **Action plan for your learning outcomes and product(s),**
- **Relevant theoretical background (including surveys, questionnaires, interviews, case studies, etc.),**
- **Cited sources (in-text if applicable),**
- **Bibliography.**

Consult your student agenda for formatting and citation!

Example of a proposal for a product /outcome:

WHAT? Nature of the service	
WHY?	
WHAT FOR? Aims, objectives, purposes	
HOW LONG? Scope	
WHERE? Location	
HOW? Activities	
WHEN? Schedule, timelines	
WITH WHOM? Target population, group members, service supporters	
WHO? Human resources	
WITH WHAT? Material resources	

Structure of the FINAL WRITTEN WORK

1. **Cover page (Student agenda) (C1)**
2. **Table of contents (C1)**
3. **Introduction (200-300 words) (C1)**
 - *What is your research about? What is your guiding question?*
 - *Which global context are you exploring through?*
 - *What is the challenge? What kind of a problem will you try to solve through your research?*
 - *Define your learning outcome.*
 - *What is your action going to be? Why did you choose this?*
 - *What is your goal? What goal(s) have you set yourself for the action part?*
 - *How are you planning to reach your goal(s)?*
4. **Body (and subtitles) = your previous + new knowledge (A1, A2, A3, C2)**
 - *Investigating (key terms defined, new knowledge of the topic – arguments and examples to support your thesis)*
 - *Taking action (describe the action you have taken to achieve your goal(s); does it have a clear connection to your chosen global context?)*
 - *What are some major conclusions you can draw from your research (in connection to the introduction)?*
 - *How does the investigation part link to or even solve the title (inquiry question) of your research paper?*
 - *Was the global context the best one or should there be any changes made now that you're ahead of your action part?*
5. **Conclusion (200-300 words) (D1 & D2& D3)**
 - *How successful were you in reaching your goal(s) of the research part? Did you need to change your goal along the way? Explain.*
 - *What worked well in your plan? What went wrong?*
 - *What have I learned about myself and others through this activity? What skills, attitudes and values have I developed?*
 - *How did my project benefit others?*
 - *What might I do differently next time to improve?*
 - *How can I apply what I have learned in other real life situations?*
 - *Did I receive any feedback during this activity? How has that helped me?*
 - *How can your work be improved and/or expanded in the future?*
 - *Reflect upon learning outcomes you defined at the beginning of the project.*
6. **Bibliography / Sources for the report, for the project (Student agenda) (A3)**

The expected length of the whole project is 1,500 to 2,500 words.
