

How to adapt to Slovenia?

You planned a wonderful trip to Slovenia, but are worried about your poor knowledge of Slovenian culture? Not a problem! This blog will teach you useful words, main celebrations, and etiquette that will help you while traveling!

1. Simple etiquette and table manners.

The first and super important thing is, of course, etiquette! If you are always thinking how not to disgrace yourself in a restaurant or other places, than read the following. This blog will tell you about important customs, table manners and traditions that will help you not to worry about your behavior.

1.1 Meeting and greeting etiquette.

- If you are meeting someone for the first time, you should shake their hand and smile.

- You should keep eye contact when chatting.

- Family members and close friends may kiss each other twice on a cheek and hug you. It may sound strange, but cute, and you should understand that not everyone does this.

If you meet someone you do not know, you should adress them "Gospa" (Madam),
"Gospodična" (Miss), or "Gospod" (Sir).

First names used only if you are talking to your family member or close friend, otherwise, you should use the surname until the person agrees to using the first name, or it will be seriously rude. If you are lucky and you were invited to a birthday party and you greet someone, it is traditional to kiss this person three times – once on each cheek.

- Giving gifts at the first meeting are not that important, you should do that later. But some souvenirs are also acceptable. There is only one important thing: make sure that the present is not expensive, or person will be in a uncomfortable position.

1.2 Dining etiquette.

- Arrive on time or within 5 minutes. It will show your respect for the hosts, so do not be late to a meeting, or people will be offended by your terrible behavior! Only joking, but try not to be late. - When you come into the house, you should remove your shoes at the door. You also will be offered slippers to wear.

- You should wear conservative clothes.

- Try to separate your modern life and business life while talking to the host or somebody else.

1.3. Eating etiquette.

- Slovenians usually order soups as the first course, so salads are brought to the table after the main dish. There are many types of meat food on the menus in Slovenia, but fish is also popular.

- What about tipping? It is not a big part of culture in Slovenia, but staff service receives poor wages, so you can leave a small amount if you liked how they worked.

Now we are going to talk about useful words and phrases, that will help you with communication in Slovenia. I will only teach you the most important words and phrases, which you need to know.

Good morning - Dobro jutro;

Good day - Dober dan;

Good evening - Dober večer;

Goodbye – Nasvidenje;

Bye – Adijo;

Yes – Da;

No – Ne;

Please – Prosim;

Thank you – Hvala;

Shop – Trgovina;

Post - Pošta;

Railway station - Železniška postaja;

Bus station - Avtobusna postaja;

Hospital - Bolnišnica;

Restaurant – Gostilna;

Drink - Pijača;

Water – Voda;

Food – Hrana;

Useful phrases:

What is your name? - Kako ti je ime?

Where do you come from? - Od kod prihajaš?

How much does it cost? - Koliko stane?

What is the time? - Koliko je ura?

It is eight o'clock. - Ura je osem.

How are you? - Kako si?

I do not understand – Ne razumem.

Thank you – Hvala.

My name is... - Moje ime je...

How can I help you? - Kako ti lahko pomagam?

Help! - Na pomoč!

Stop - Stoj

Are you okay? - Ste v redu?
