On New year in Ljubljana in the centre, they put a big Christmas tree and many Christmas decorations.



Slovenia celebrates day of Slovenia's statehood. It is a holiday that occurs every 25th June in Slovenia to commemorate the country's declaration of Independence from Yugoslavia in 1991.

15-25 February Slovenia celebrates kurentovanje. It is a holiday that is connected to Pust. It's when people dress in different costumes. It is Slovenia's most popular and ethnologically significant carnival event first organised in 1960 by Drago Hals.



Table manners

I will tell you about table manners in Slovenia so you will not be surprised when you will have dinner with your friends. Slovenians do not like when you are late, the maximum is 5 minutes. You must dress conservatively and nice. If you come to visit a friend, you do not often have to bring a present. When you see someone, you greet or when you go to a shop or into the library, you greet, you say 'Dober dan'. Eating without elbows. When you start eating, then you say in Slovenian 'Dober tek'. When you come to someone's house, you put your shoes off and put on slippers if necessary. If you are eating, you need to put your phone away.

Transport

Slovenians generally use the bus in Ljubljana. Urbana is needed for paying and transport. You can also travel around by taxi. You can also use an electric scooter called Bolt but you must apply on your phone and you have to pay with your credit card. 1 step is to apply via the app on your phone called Bolt, 2 step is to take your phone and you will see a QRCODE, 3 step is to pay with you credit card and then you can drive.
